Policy on Authenticity of Student Work and Academic Integrity

The <u>University policy on academic honesty</u> has been adopted by the College of Education and Human Services (COEHS), which, in addition, publishes its own <u>statement on plagiarism and establishes procedures and consequences</u>. The MFT Program, holding the assumption that an atmosphere of safety, respect, and appreciation is only possible in an environment of honesty and trustworthiness, adheres to the policy on academic honesty espoused by the university and follows the procedures adopted by the <u>COEHS</u>. When students cheat, all students are adversely affected.

All academic and/or clinical work—including but not limited to assignments, exams, research, paper productions (reflections, term papers, research, literature reviews, etc.), projects, posters, journals—required by the faculty and submitted in partial or complete fulfillment of course requirements, must wholly reflect the student's own work.

Work that fails to properly cite sources and/or the submission of others' work while
claiming it as one's own production will be considered plagiarized and will result in the
faculty member filing an <u>Academic Integrity Report (AIR)</u>. The result of this filing could
result in a grade of D or F for the work submitted or for the entire course. In addition,
academic dismissal may result.
